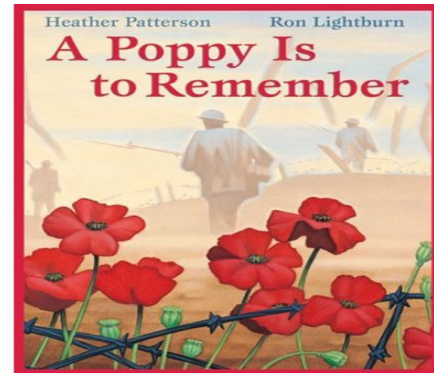

### In Flanders Fields

by John McCrae, May 1915



In Flanders fields the poppies blow  
Between the crosses, row on row,  
That mark our place; and in the sky  
The larks, still bravely singing, fly  
Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago  
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,  
Loved and were loved, and now we lie  
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:  
To you from failing hands we throw  
The torch; be yours to hold it high.  
If ye break faith with us who die  
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow

How did the bright red poppy that we all wear in November become Canada's symbol of honoring those who fought for our freedom on Remembrance Day?

Moving text coupled with stunning illustrations by Governor General's Award winning artist, Ron Lightburn, explain the symbolism behind the poppy. A bonus for teachers is the five-page spread all about the poem, "In Flanders Fields," Canada's wartime and peacekeeping endeavors, and the adoption of the poppy as our Remembrance Day emblem.
